- _____ Noun: The new top of the stem called a terminal shoot, which is last year's growth
- _____ Noun: Top width of foliage above the trunk of deciduous tree
- _____ Noun: New growth bud of a coniferous tree, often lighter green
- _____ Noun: Leaves
- _____ Noun: Lower story bush with many branches, usually soft wood
- _____ Adjective: Trees that lose their leaves annually
- _____ Adjective: Cone-bearing trees with needle-like leaves
- _____ Noun: Section of a forest
- _____ Noun: Surface soil, up to 10 – 15 cm depth
- _____ Noun: Next layer of soil, between 10-25 cm depth
- _____ Adjective: Materials that were once alive
- _____ Adjective: Materials that were never alive
- _____ Noun: Leaves, compost or wood chips
- _____ Verb: To spread leaves, compost, or wood chips on the ground to prevent growth of unwanted plants and to conserve water
- _____ Verb: To trim or cut back unwanted parts of a plant
- _____ Noun: An unwanted plant - often with traditional medicinal uses
- _____ Verb: To cut out or take out unwanted plants from an area
- _____ Noun: A study area that is 1/25 of a hectare (20m x 20m) area
- _____ Noun: A piece of material laid on the ground around a newly planted tree anchored at corners by large U "staples"
- _____ Noun: White plastic wrappers twisted around the lower stem
- _____ Noun: a plastic cylinder loosely around the trunk of young trees
- _____ Verb: Repeatedly measure, record specific data over time
- _____ Noun: Information gathered from observing and measuring
- _____ Noun: Circular growth of branches around the trunk of a conifer
- _____ Noun: A node or site on a twig of last year's leaf bud scales
- _____ Noun: An instrument to measure diameter
- _____ Noun: Bud scale scar of the previous year's growth
